SEC. 14-220 (G) It shall be a misdemeanor and a public nuisance for the innkeeper to permit, encourage or allow the use of its required parking area or for any person to use the required parking area for impromptu, unpermitted outdoor events for congregational purposes, involving the open possession or consumption of alcohol, or for the preparation, dispensing or consumption of food or drink, or for the placement of objects such as tents, trailers, structures, cooking devices, appliances, tables, chairs, coolers or the like so that the parking area cannot be used for its intended purpose; provided however that such events that are specifically permitted through legislative or administrative action, or sponsored by the business license holder in compliance with regulations governing such outdoor events, are not prohibited.

SEC. 14-222 (E) It shall be a misdemeanor and a public nuisance for the business license holder to permit, encourage or allow the public nuisance use of its required parking areas; provided however that such events that are specifically permitted through legislative or administrative action, or sponsored by the business license holder in compliance with regulations governing such outdoor events are not included.
